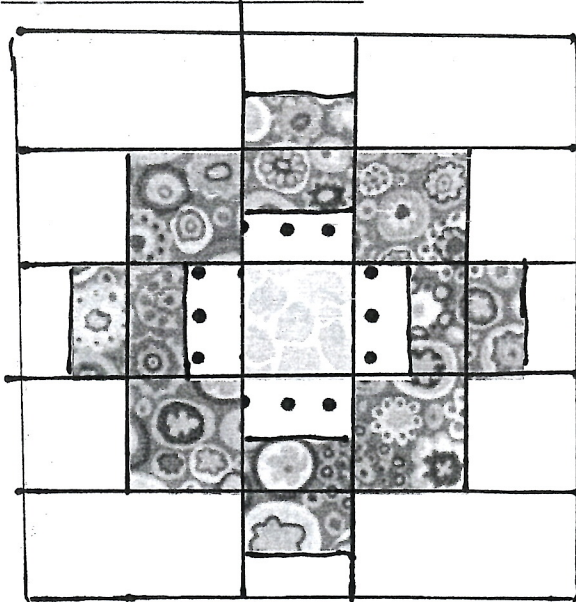


## Circle Flower Blocks

10-1/2" unfinished

CSnS April 2025



**BACKGROUND...** Very pale yellow of any kind

**OUTER PETALS...** Pinks, Oranges, Yellows in hot, bright & fun colors, in prints, or whatever you have in your stash

**INNER PETALS...** Use the white with black dots provided; if you make more blocks, any white with a small print in black or other color.

**CENTER...** Use the bright yellow-orange provided; if you make more blocks, use any yellow-orange.

### CUTTING:

**BACKGROUND:** Four: 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"  
Four: 1-1/2" x 2-1/2"  
Four: 2-1/2" squares

**OUTER PETALS:** Eight: 2-1/2" squares

**INNER PETALS:** Four: 1-1/2" x 2-1/2"

**CENTER:** One: 2-1/2" square

*\* PROVIDED FABRICS  
NEED TO BE  
TRIMMED  
TO SIZE.*

1. Sew FOUR background 2-1/2" sqs to FOUR outer petal 2-1/2" squares.
2. To complete the four corner sets, take those pairs you just sewed, and the four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips, and lay them out like this, and sew:

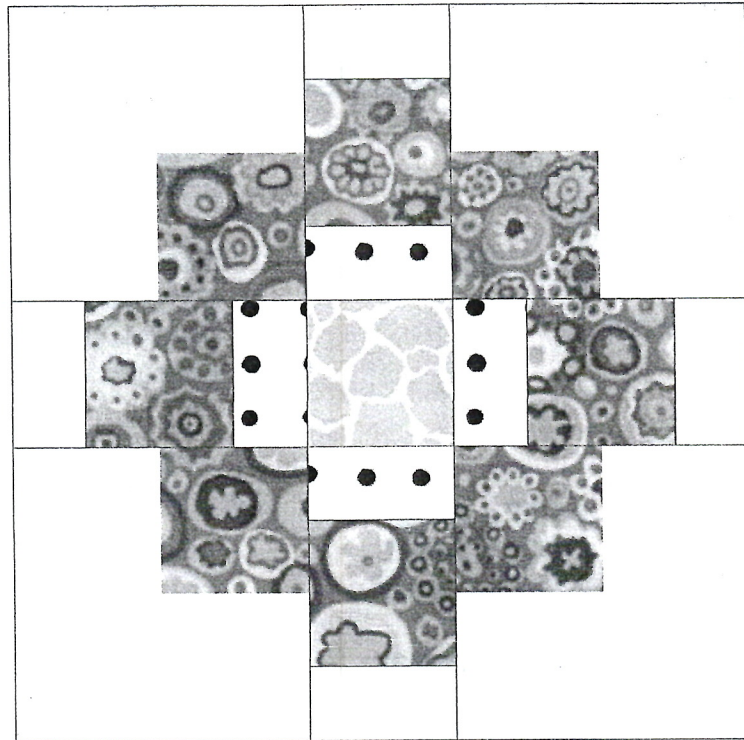


3. Take the remaining four outer petal 2-1/2" squares, and sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" background strip to one side of the square. Then sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" inner petal strip to the opposite side of the squares, like this:



4. Layout: With your four corner sets, and your four inner petal sets, and center square, you now have the pieces for a 9-patch shape. Lay the center patch down. Place the white dotted patch ends on the four sides of the center square. Lay in the corners carefully, making sure to have background fabric all the way around.

5. Get a cup of something that makes you happy, and double check your layout. Especially check that the corners are in the right places. Sew that little beauty together.
6. Nice Work!!! You have made a fun, happy block !!!

**FOR A FUTURE QUILT (NOT for this month's BOM): 20-1/2" center block**

If you want to make a large center block, for a quilt of your own, here are the cutting sizes for a 20-1/2" block:

**CUTTING:**

<b>BACKGROUND:</b>	<b>Four:</b>	<b>4-1/2" x 8-1/2"</b>
	<b>Four:</b>	<b>2-1/2" x 4-1/2"</b>
	<b>Four:</b>	<b>4-1/2" squares</b>
<b>OUTER PETALS:</b>	<b>Eight:</b>	<b>4-1/2" squares</b>
<b>INNER PETALS:</b>	<b>Four:</b>	<b>2-1/2" x 4-1/2"</b>
<b>CENTER:</b>	<b>One:</b>	<b>4-1/2" square</b>

The 10-1/2" blocks are really good for chain piecing if you're making this quilt at home. You can make a lot of these blocks fairly quickly. And, they are very easy to cut down to 10-1/4" if you need to. Just remember to cut the 20-1/2" block down a tiny bit also if you square your blocks down to smaller than 10-1/2".
