


Part Three

Stitch and Flip

With right sides together, align a green D patch on one corner of a red



Using this method and following the illustrations below, sew the red and green D's to the C's, one Flying Geese, 1 quarter-square triangle and an E patch. Likewise join the G's to a white multiprint C and an F as shown.




Making a 3-D Bow Tie

Fold the red print 2 C in half with wrong sides together. With right sides together, sandwich the folded C between


C/D unit 1 and a quarter-square triangle. Join, catching the short end of the folded C patch. Press open.









Likewise, sandwiching the opposite end of C, sew together C/D unit 2 and a white multiprint C. Again, press open.



To create a three-dimensional center for the bow, open the folded C as shown.

Aligning raw edges, pin in place and then sew these units together. Press the bow open.






3 Assembling the Quilt Top
Following the assembly diagram, join the bow, Flying Geese, quarter-square triangles, stitch-and-flip units and E.

On each end of 2 mountain chains, join an I patch to make the top and bottom chains.


Sew a mountain chain to each side of the quilt. Add the top and bottom chains.



Assembly

Quilting and Finishing
To mark the grid quilting, align a ruler with the seam lines of the patchwork and extend the lines into the center of the wreath. Also extend the seam lines into the corners as shown.

Layer the lining, batting and quilt top and baste the layers together. Quilt the patches in the ditch and then quilt the marked lines.



Quilting Placement

Join the binding strips to make one long strip. Sew this strip to the quilt to enclose the edges.

To show off your fine detective work and to decorate for the holiday season, add a sleeve to the lining. \blacksquare
